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OLA students achieve academic excellence as A* grades have more than doubled over last year

Abingdon-on-Thames, Oxfordshire – Our Lady's Abingdon has recorded another successful year of A-level results.

The percentage of A* grades increased from 7% to 16%, higher than pre-Covid results. A fantastic 88% of EPQ (Extended Project Qualification) students achieved A* - A and two-thirds of all students achieved a top grade (A*, A, B) in at least one of their subjects.

Five students, Benjamin, Aaryan, Alvin, Alfie and Benedict achieved straight A* and A grades, compared to two last year. Benjamin achieved an incredible 4 A*s. Alfie not only attained two A*'s in Physics and Maths and an A in Computer studies - he also achieved an A in Further maths. Aaryan also achieved an A in AS Further Maths, while Virginia, who joined OLA for sixth form achieved her first choice of university and the next highest grades in the cohort. Grades A* - B and C returned a similar result to last year with some students achieving a good academic growth on their GCSE results.

OLA has a diverse range of students, some of whom have additional needs, and it is a testament to the strong relationships between students and teachers that each and every individual is able to fulfil their potential.

In addition, **91%** of OLA 6th students were offered places at their firm or insurance university at a range of top Russell Group and various other universities across the country.
